"Sunday at Home" Old-Time Fun at T.C. Steele State Historic Site

Enjoy Father's Day at the T.C. Steele State Historic Site, as the site carries on a tradition of old-fashioned Hoosier hospitality. Try your hand at hand-cranking homemade ice cream and playing old-time games, participating in the annual watermelon seed spitting contest, and creating the perfect Father's Day gift at the craft tables (\$1 fee for materials).

Visitors are invited to join in by wearing period costume of the late 1800s or early 1900s. Ribbons will be awarded for the best costumes. Most event activities are free, and visitors in old-fashioned costume will be admitted to the guided building tour free of charge. Terri and Richard King perform traditional Irish and early American music throughout the afternoon.

"Sunday at Home" continues a tradition that began with Theodore Clement Steele, noted Hoosier impressionist artist, and his wife Selma. They welcomed guests to their Brown County residence in the 1910s and 1920s to see Steele's artwork and experience the hospitality of their home.
